





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### PROJECTS IN THE YEAR 2021-2022 VILLAGE CENTERS

### **KIDS**

Kids in the age group of 3 to 6 are naturally eager for knowledge and making them learn in a thoughtfully prepared environment makes the whole concept of learning a joyful process at Vidyarambam. In their early childhood, Vidyarambam children learn through sensory - motor activities and work with various specially designed material that develop their cognitive powers. The curriculum incorporates learning numbers and language using play way methods in a regular school environment.



### SUPPORT CLASS JUNIOR (SCJ)

Class 2 and Class 3 students of rural schools are enrolled here and the teachers match appropriate lessons from the school curriculum with the Vidyarambam material where by learning become more practical and is naturally absorbed and internalized. Children learn the basic concepts of Mathematics and they were also trained to read fluently in Tamil and English. The Phonetic method to learn English words help the children to learn the language in a simpler way.



### SUPPORT CLASS SENIOR (SCS)

Support class senior comprises of class 4 and class 5 students. Here too, the school curriculum is integrated with Vidyarambam materials and children acquired different concepts of Mathematics through hands-on learning which is more practical and application oriented. Children work individually and in groups that lead to a deeper understanding of language, Mathematics, Science, Music and much more. Children learn the basic concepts of English Grammar using different materials that made the learning more effective and enjoyable.



### MODEL FULL TIME ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOL

### (Rotary Vidyarambam School)

The full-time Primary school for the children of Tsunami affected families and nearby fishing communities was launched in the year 2008 at Nagapattinam and has been imparting free value education for many years now that has empowered the less privileged children with knowledge and excellence.



The curriculum is designed in such a way that the three dimensions of learning - Academics, Extra-curricular activities and Sports are given importance which results in a well-balanced program for children. Academics are taught to children in a more practical and joyful environment using indigenous Vidyarambam kits and also through audio-visual presentations. The school focuses on the Holistic development of the children wherein the children are encouraged to involve in diverse activities that include Gardening, playing long-established indoor games like Pallangkuzhi Pambaram, Chess, Carrom, art-forms like Rangoli, Arts, Arts and Crafts, maintaining the School campus and also taking turns to conduct the School Assembly every day. Their Physical and Mental discipline is instilled by practising Yogasana every day and the school also has a well-stocked Library that inculcates the reading habit in children in augmenting their knowledge.

At RV school, learning happens outside the four walls of the classroom as well. Children go out for nature walk every week to observe and study the environment outside. They collect different materials like leaves, stones, twigs, paper and classify them in the classroom as living and non-living things. They also use hand lens to observe and appreciate the wonders in nature. They also set up a model milk booth outside the class room and use different measuring vessels to understand the concept of 'Capacity' in Mathematics.



### **MOBILE TOY VAN**

The Mobile Toy Van of Vidyarambam shuttles from village to village with educational and scientific toys and games kindling the enthusiasm and curiosity of children in the rural areas. The games and toys have been carefully chosen to make their learning practical and joyful, opening their minds to see beyond their immediate settings and environment and making them fly on the wings of imagination.



Children are encouraged to play with these Mind bending Toys for about 2 hours. The Brain storming games like the Memory retention games, Arithmetic games, Word building, jigsaw puzzles etc...develop hand-muscle coordination; activate the left and right brain there by enriching the imagination and creativity in children. A firm Foundation is offered to kids and it enables hands on learning through play way method on basic concepts in Maths and English language. These toys aim at encouraging children to probe beyond the obvious objectives through discussions and reasoning which leads to the development of their linguistic skills too.

This is a boon for the little ones who do not have access to any such play material. At the end of the session within the school, the Vidyarambam Tutors who accompany the toy van spend "circle time" with the children, singing songs which helps in reinforcing the concepts that they have just learnt.

Vidyarambam is successful in alleviating the fear and hatred towards Education among the rural children by showing them that learning is an interesting aspect in their life. If children can be tapped at the right age and when learning becomes joyful, the hidden talents of the young minds start to bloom and this thirst for knowledge is infused in children once they become a part of Vidyarambam centers.

### Village Library

A library is set up in each village having a learning centre, to cater children's story books and novels to people in the village. Anybody from the village could access the books for free.



### **Easy Learning English (ELE)**

### Goal

- Make the process of learning English as a second language more enjoyable
- Ability to read and write in English and achieve a certain amount of fluency in conversing in English
- Negate the fear of learning English which directly reflects in the drop-out rates in schools



### **Objective**

The ELE program has been designed in such a way that the goals mentioned above could be achieved within a specified time frame. The objective of achieving the short-term and long term goals during the program has been planned systematically by drafting specific steps which gets monitored at the end of every week. The teachers get ample support from the ELE trainers who help them to achieve the weekly objectives by clearing their doubts and guiding them at every step.

### **Easy Learning Maths (ELM) Goal**

Four levels of skill level are targeted across the primary

levels (based on appropriate grade level):

- Number sense
- Measurement
- Geometry(Spatial)

### **Objective**



To teach Mathematics in a fun way covering a broad range of knowledge and skills and at the same time eliminating the phobia associated with the subject. The program works hand in hand with the State Board syllabus and supports class room teaching with interactive fun based activity and games. The program covers the basic tenets of seeing, hearing, and doing Maths by deriving inspiration from nature and everyday objects around us.



For example, children measure the length, width and perimeter of a leaf, to find the area and measuring the trunk of a tree to derive  $\pi r^2$  The program provides a strong foundation in the subject that forms the basis to succeed as these children get to higher grades and face increased complexity in Maths.

### **School Model Learning Centre (SMLC)**

The main objective of Vidyarambam's SMLC program during school hours is to integrate the State Board syllabus with the Vidyarambam Material. Under the guidance of academic experts, Vidyarambam has designed educational kits for various age groups starting from kids to seniors. As and when concepts are



introduced in the classroom according to the Samacheer Syllabus, Vidyarambam teachers impart the same concepts to children by using the corresponding material from the educational kit. This hands-on method of learning makes learning easier, practical and enjoyable. 'Do and Understand' is the motive behind using relevant materials to learn English Grammar and mathematical concepts like Number system, Fractions etc. and not just stop with 'Talk and Chalk' method that is extensively adopted in most of the schools.



## Rotary Vidyarambam Model School witnessed the following events during the year 2021 – 22.

Tamil Nadu Government announced to reopen of the Schools virtually on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2021. Due to Covid 19 pandemic situation, academic studies for the year 2021-22 continued to be done online through WhatsApp.

The birthday of former Chief Minister Kamarajar was celebrated on 15<sup>th</sup> July as Education Development Day. The teachers communicated with the children over the phone on that day about the contribution of the Late Sri. Kamarajarto the field of education. Especially about the implementation of Mid-day meals in schools for the poor children in the State and how they are being followed till day.

Former President late Dr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam's Memorial Day was observed on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2021. The teachers shared their memories of the Late Dr. Abdul Kalam as a role model to the student community and the simplicity with which he lived his life.

Admission for theacademic year 2021- 22 was held on 28<sup>th</sup> July at the school and assessed the responsiveness of the children doing activities for five skills development (Fine motor development, cognitive development, physical motor development, language development, and hand-eye coordination).



From August 5, 2021, children were instructed to attend school at the rate of five students per day.

Vidyarambam Trust Founder and Ex Correspondent of Rotary Vidyarambam School Late Sri. V. Ranganathan's birthday was celebrated on the 27<sup>th</sup> of August. Alumni of the School joined the online meeting and narrated their experiences.

Teachers' Day was celebrated on 5<sup>th</sup> September in the School. Mrs. and Mr. Balasubramanian of Aanandam Charitable Trust presented the teachers with a memento. Teachers discussed their experiences of teaching and new methods for giving activities through WhatsApp which was followed by lunch.

On the 27<sup>th</sup> of September, the alumni of our school were introduced as part-time teachers, and arrangements were made for the alumni to help the children, now attending the school in three villages. Online classes were conducted successfully with the help of alumni.



On the 21<sup>st</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of October 2021, Parent Teachers Association (PTA) meeting was held at the school. Explained the school reopening date and the health safety precautions that children and parents should follow after the school reopens.

The school reopened on 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021 after a long gap due to Corona 19 pandemic, with children eagerly attending the school. Decorations were done at the School and a warm welcome was given to the children. The safety precautionary measures were carried out in strict compliance with all the conditions mentioned by the Government in the school.

Children's Day was celebrated on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2021and Mahakavi Bharathiyar's birthday was celebrated on December 11<sup>th</sup> by singing his songs and reciting his poems. All these gatherings were done complying with precautions from the spread of the Corona as laid by the

Government.

On December 24<sup>th</sup>, Christmas and New Year were celebrated at the School. Students were trained to make the Greetings card for the occasions. One of the First Standard students surprised the other children by disguising himself as Santa Claus.



Vidyarambam Founder's Memorial Day was observed on 25<sup>th</sup> December. Then the School was closed for the Christmas holidays. Due to the spread of Corona again, the schools did not open after the New Year, Even during the closure of schools, efforts to ensure the continuity of academic education were fruitful. Textbooks were distributed to the children first. Then worksheets were prepared on the basis of the syllabus and forwarded to the children by the school through teachers and parents.

Teachers provided training through video, and WhatsApp to improve their writing skills. 5(five) children per day were brought to school and their current academic standard was tested. The ability of the children in subjects like Mathematics, English, and Tamil was also assessed and recorded. The exercises prepared were personalized to suit the children's abilities.

The students were taught many activities through online classes such as science activities, storytelling, seed germination activities, map drawing, drawing, and knowing about National leaders. On important national days like Independence Day and Republic Day, the children disguised themselves like National leaders, communicated from their homes, and did their part very well.

Children were provided with worksheets in person. Three of the villages with the highest number of children studying in the school were selected. The alumni of our school in those villages were introduced as part-time teachers and conducted lessons for the children. The alumni were involved in the success of all the educational endeavors of the school teachers.

The School reopened again after a gap of one and a half months in February 2022. The children were happy to come back to school. Tablets were given to the School teachers to teach the children through Audio-visuals. QR code was scanned from the books and stories and rhymes were shown and taught in the class.

The Kindergarten section was opened on February 21<sup>st</sup>. Most of the children came happily while some of them were crying being the first day of their school.

On 21<sup>st</sup> Feb.2022, Mr. Balasubramanian and his family from Aanandam Charitable Trust visited our RV School. They visited all the classes and appreciated the activities of the children.





Science Day was celebrated in our School on February 28<sup>th</sup>. Projects on Air, Maya Bazar, Plants, etc. were displayed and explained to the teachers and students of the other Schools.

Water conservation day was celebrated on March 23<sup>rd</sup> and the students were explained about the conservation of water after the morning prayers. The drama was enacted on this theme in the evening.

### Vidyarambam - Events for the year 2021 - 2022

In the first week of June 2021, online classes were started for the children belonging to Vidyarambam centers. The children will do the homework and activities given by the teachers through WhatsApp and send it to the teachers who in turn encouraged the children by correcting and praising it.



Loose letter cards in Tamil and English were introduced to children and were taught to form small words. The noun and verb were introduced to children studying online in the second and third weeks of June. Voice records and videos of nouns and verbs were prepared and sent to children. By the end of June, the teachers had taught the children a hundred nouns and a hundred verbs. Children study their lessons using the teaching-learning material of Vidyarambam.

Classes were conducted on the basis of the syllabus in the textbooks after continuing to provide basic education in Tamil, English and Mathematics to the children throughout the month of June.



Worksheets from Tamil, English, Mathematics and Science subjects were prepared and given to children from class one to class five. Skill development tests were also placed on the children and the skills they received in their education were noted. Emphasis was placed on the activities of science and mathematics in the textbooks and exercises were given to the children. The content in the textbooks was compiled and the video and audio required for them were prepared and shown to the children.

Direct classes were started in July 2021 considering the educational well-being of the children. Vidyarambam regular classes were

conducted for children following the safety procedures with the permission of the parents. Teachers and children received great cooperation from parents to make these classes a success. Using these classes, which started after a long vacation, the teachers made every effort to strengthen the basic education of the children.



Independence Day and Teachers' Day were celebrated in all centers of Vidyarambam.

Gandhi Jayanthi was celebrated in the centers on October 2 and various competitions were held and prizes were given to the children.

In the last week of October, the mid-test was taken for the Vidyarambam's children. In all centers of Vidyarambam, science activities were taught to children every Friday.






In the first week of November, all government schools opened after the lockdown, and Vidyarambam centers continued to be held in schools.

On November 14, children's day was celebrated in all our centers. Children from Vidyarambam centers came dressed as Nehru.

After Christmas, the schools were closed again due to Covid as the Government imposed a lockdown again. The situation arose where classes had to be conducted online only. Electronic gadgets like Tablet, Laptops and computers are not so easily available to rural students. All the volunteers of Vidyarambam were given a tablet and instructed to conduct classes to benefit the village children. At Vidyarambam, 3055 students have been benefitted in learning lessons using the tablet successfully. This tablet is widely used for kindergarten children and children studying beyond the fourth grade.

### **Usage of Tablets for Learning**

One of the main objectives of this survey was to investigate how primary, upper primary and high school students used their tablets for learning. The usage of the tablets for various activities was represented on this chart. The results showed that majority of the students used their tablets to access course-related materials, which included usually using their tablets towards searching for information (69.08%), reading reference notes (53.28%), participating in online discussion (10.88%), listening and watching education related audio, and video (20.0%), Downloading teaching and learning notes (69.08%) and storing learning materials (20.80%).



### **Activities using Tablets**

Vidyarambam has a different teaching methodology as teachers using over 250 Learning materials for teaching make a direct learning transition for children. The use of this tab began with the teachers of Vidyarambam, who had individual teaching skills such as coaching, learning based on their abilities with individual focus on each child's education and realizing imaginations through animation and showing them to children.





Benefits of children using tabs are categorized from Kindergarten to High School.

Many of the things that children are taught in kindergarten will be to place more emphasis on imagination, and this tab was very helpful in realizing their imaginative flows. This tab also has a huge role to play in teaching children the correct pronunciation as the English and Tamil pronunciation of rural teachers vary by district.

Phonemes were taught to students in grades one to grade five. Noun and Verb related videos and classes were taken for children with the help of TAB by QR CODE for lessons in



Samacheer book. Also in English pronunciation, tongue twister etc. were taught through the tab daily for the use of the children. Worksheets were given at the end of each lesson to test the children's learning ability. When using this tab we realized how important visual impulse is for children to blend and read words. With the voice engine, children were able to learn the correct pronunciation for complicated words. Many of the stories were animated and the best voice expert videos for storytelling were downloaded and shown to the

children. This improves children's gesture and voice modulation during storytelling.

In February, the lockdown was lifted by the Government, and the schools were reopened. Vidyarambam also started the directed classes in the School.





# Report for Akshara Learning Centers in Mandapam Block in Ramanathapuram District supported by NSE Foundation for the year 2021-2022

Due to Covid 19 pandemic situation, classes were started online in the fourth week of May 2021 for the children of Vidyarambam Centers to ensure continuity of studies.

Children did their homework and activities given through WhatsApp and the teachers after evaluating, encouraged them by appreciating their work.

Vidyarambam conducted classes for eight centers with the consent of the parents and complied with the Covid 19 pandemic safety procedures. Teachers and children received great cooperation from parents to make these classes a success.





With the start of the classes after a long gap, the teachers made every effort to streng then the basic education of the children.

With the introduction of loose letter cards in Tamil and English, children could complete the exercises in their textbook and learnt to form small words.

During the second and third weeks of June 2021, introduced nouns and verbs to children studying online.

Voice records and videos of nouns and verbs were prepared and sent to children. By the end of June, the teachers taught the children a hundred nouns and a hundred verbs.

Vidyarambam Centers were opened for the academic year 2021-22. The first six centers were started and baseline tests were conducted for the children.

The VDG meeting was held on 3rd August 2021 and 15 parents attended the meeting. Teachers of Panchayat Union Primary School visited Vidyarambam Center in Karaiyur village. Our tutors explained to the children how to maintain hygiene and demonstrated hand-washing methods to protect ourselves from Corona.

On 4<sup>th</sup> August 2021, Panchayat Union Primary School teacher Mr. Sasikumar visited Vidyarambam Center and interacted with our Center children to assess their standard of education.



Ms. Durgadevi, a teacher at Vidyarambam Center visited the people of Pudhuroad village from door to door and advised them to get vaccinated for COVID-19. Later, attended the vaccination camp also held there.

The VDG meeting was held on 6th August at Gandhi Nagar village. Parents were requested to get vaccinated. Parents were informed in detail about the efforts being taken by Vidyarambam Centers to ensure that the children are not missing out on education in this pandemic situation.

On 14<sup>th</sup> August, Mr. Christopher, a Teacher of the Child Protection Center, visited our Vidyarambam Centers at Karaiyur and Pudhuroad villages. He assessed the capability of children's knowledge of languages and math skills.

Teacher's day was celebrated in all the centers on 5th September and all the teachers along with the children enjoyed doing various activities.

Children were taught to classify words as nouns, and verbs, make sentences with words and match pictures with words.

Mid-test was conducted in October for the centers that started in July. Training for the teachers was conducted on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 13th of November 2021 in the Green Rameswaram Trust Office.

The Coordinators and the assessors conducted the training program in which 40 tutors participated. The Training started every day with a prayer followed by warm-up exercises and singing. The training was given using our flash cards and VT materials in the kit.

The new centers were started from 11<sup>th</sup> to 17th November and the assessors took the baseline tests.

Mrs. Prabhavathi, the State Coordinator visited the Pamban Center located in the Mandapam area of Ramanathapuram District on 12th December. Body parts and their functioning were taught through games and songs.

The children were assessed with questions from the course conducted by the teacher and their academic performance was evaluated.

Chinnapaalam center was inspected on  $10^{th}$  December and Mrs. Muthurevathi, was teaching Tamil and English letters and their sounds to first and second graders.

Visited the senior centers held in the village of Chinnapaalam. Various questions were asked in English and Tamil using the chart and answers were obtained from the children.





The training for teachers was held on December 11 and 12 at the Green Rameswaram office. The teachers were trained by Coordinators and Assessors. 44 (forty-four) Teachers participated in this Training.





Every day, the Training starts with Tamil Thai Vazhthu, Yoga, and Warm-up exercises before the commencement of training sessions. Feedback was sought from the teachers participating in the training program about their Centers' activities.

The coordinator conducted the training on important points like how to introduce the English alphabet, Tamil alphabet, and sounds while teaching the children. The training included using letter charts, word-building towers, word cards, sentence cards, flashcards, verb cards, animal charts, and story cards among the learning materials developed by Vidyarambam to teach letters, words, sentences, etc. in Tamil and English. The training was conducted on how to teach children to play using the above cards.

The Panchayat Schools were opened after a long gap of twenty months.

Permission was obtained from the Block Educational Officer, Mrs. Sutha Mathi, to provide supplementary education in Govt. Schools situated in the Thangachimadam area and Our Coordinator also visited these Centers

The Coordinator & Assessors visited the newly opened Centers at Kaattupillayar Temple Village on December 14 and Parvatham and Kadukattana Patti villages on December 15. The assessors / Coordinator conducted Pre test and the assessor's meeting was held in the afternoon on that day.

Village Development Group meeting was held on 6,7,18 and 23<sup>rd</sup> of December and the children demonstrated their ability to develop words and sentences using the Vidyarambam educational materials. The Headmistress emphasized how VT educational materials are used and how it makes a difference in education. The assessors and coordinator explained how the centers are running with NSE funding.



The Schools were again closed due to the spread of Corona in the last week of December and reopened only in February 2022.

Since the schools were closed, 34 centers were started in January 2022. Out of this, 4 (four) Centers were online and the other 30 (thirty)centers were at teachers' houses and community centers. The teachers of the centers taught the children about special occasions like celebrations of Independence Day/Teacher's Day/Children's Day/Republic Day and their importance while celebrating them in the Centers.

Assessors Chithra and Arokia Jasmine met the Chief Education Officer and requested their permission to train government school teachers to teach using the learning materials of Vidyarambam.



Coordinator Ms. Prabhavathi and Assessor Ms.Malar visited village centers at Tharavai Thoppu and Akkal Madam in Mandapam Area on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2022. The children were taught Memory games, and language skills -nouns and verbs, etc. by the coordinator.

The Coordinator visited Centers in Gandhi Nagar, Meyyampuli, Rajiv Gandhi Nagar, and Toppukkadu villages on January 28. The children in the above centers were able to do self-introduction in English and were clear about verbs and nouns. They were able to read words using phonemes.

Ms. Prabhavathi, Ms.Chitra, and Ms.Rubika visited Puthur Road Center. Children at this center made a variety of toys out of waste materials. The coordinator briefed Vidyarambam and their activities to the Puthur Road Block Educational Officer (BEO). Details of children studying in this block were given to the BEO.

Periodical Training Programme for our teachers was conducted from January 31 to February 02, 2022. Training started every day with Tamil Thai Vazhthu, Yoga, and Warm-up exercises. The teachers shared among themselves about the difference in conducting classes for children from home and from school and its impact on the children. Many exercises were given to the teachers such as phonemes in English, word reading, and sentence formation.



This training cleared the doubts of the teachers in handling the teaching and learning materials. Teachers were given several exercises to help children become strong in the basics of mathematics. The training was also given to teachers on how to solve the basic education problem of children. The teachers were assessed through a test about their learning experience in the training.

The assessors' meeting was held at the Green Trust Rameswaram office.

The coordinator and the Assessors visited Peikarumbu and Meyyampuli village centers.



Tutors and Assessors conducted the lessons at the centers. Special attention was given to the Slow-learning children who were taught using VT materials to make them understand.

The children at the Vidyarambam Center in Sembai progressed academically to the point where they could read the words themselves and classify them as nouns, and verbs. The children were taught Addition, Multiplication, and division calculations through a game called Spider MATHS. Articles are taught to children according to the Vidyarambam methodology.








### **COVID – 19 relief distribution report**

The COVID–19 pandemic has affected the lives of millions across the globe. The effects of the crisis have been felt deeply. Especially children and the elderly were particularly hard hit.

Vidyarambam has been supporting the education of rural children in TAMILNADU for nineteen years. In this crisis, Vidyarambam focused on ensuring essential services such as Health, items for daily needs, and education as a direct way of saving lives and protecting the people against the threat of epidemics. People were periodically addressed about maintaining hygiene like washing hands, wearing masks, etc.

Vidyarambam, who is in direct contact with the villagers was able to realize the plight of the villagers and was able to see the troubles of the villagers in this dire situation like the Covid 19. Understanding this, Vidyarambam landed in the field with the aim of helping children and villagers by providing essential grocery items like rice, pulses, oil, soap, etc. as relief materials.VIBHA, Mission Samriddhi, Sundar Charitable Trust, and individual donors like Chandramouli, Subramanian, and Prabhakaran donated to this cause. We made herbal drinks to build immunity and protect them from being affected by Corona. The relief material pack had 22 items packed in it by Vidyarambam Team.

These donations were done in the remote villages for the poor families in the districts of Tirunelveli, Tenkasi, Trichy, Ariyalur, Dindigul, Nagapattinam, and Mayiladuthurai. The herbal drinks were prepared every day by Vidyarambam Team and distributed to the villagers.
