## About Vidyarambam

### How Vidyarambam was born

The founder Mr. V. Ranganathan on a pursuit to work for children's education visited the poorer districts in Tamilnadu and witnessed that children in villages equated school with a free lunch and carried, not books, but aluminium plates to schools in their satchels. Thus passion to the cause got rooted to the suffering experienced by the poor illiterate village labourers. Then he decided to provide at least basic study materials to the poor children free of cost and fix a tutor to teach them. The mission got going under the name "The Beginning".

Mr. J. Vijay hearing the mission of "The Beginning" from Ranganathan motivated him to form a Public Trust with a broad mission to provide pre-primary education for 10,000 children of 3-5 age group in about 3 years.

There was a suggestion to rename the Trust. The word "vidyarambam" is derived from the Sanskrit language and it means "The beginning of literacy". Thus **Vidyarambam Trust** was born and registered on the 15th day of March 2002.

### How Vidyarambam became quality sensitive



Mrs. Prema Veeraraghavan joined the Trust and implanted the idea of quality in education. She roped in a team of eminent educationists and formed an Advisory Committee to assist in all aspects of academics. Vidyarambam's own syllabus for children was formulated suiting the rural environment and books were published. Simple, straightforward, interesting and effective **teaching aids** were developed. Training programs for the tutors were planned and imparted at frequent intervals.

### Why poor people welcome Vidyarambam

1. It brings the education almost to the doorsteps of the poor children.
2. The teachers being from the same street or the village, the parents are comfortable to send their children for learning.
3. Children are provided with interesting, graded and quality educational material free of cost.
4. The quality of education is comparable to what an urban child would get from Kinder Garten schools.



5. At pre-primary level of education, enterprising commercial firms make huge money. Vidyarambam is providing the same **free of cost**.

## How does one measure the results of Vidyarambam?

Very simple. In the first year of Vidyarambam's history, 509 children have gained confidence to begin their journey of literacy. They are moving to regular schools to join Class 1 .

## How far Vidyarambam can go?

Sky is the limit!!!! Millions of children in our country do not have the opportunity or the environment to get started on their education. Their parents are poor and/or illiterate themselves. Vidyarambam steps in to provide foundation for learning for life.

## Is Vidyarambam the only NGO doing such project?

No and Yes.

**No**, because there are many NGOs who run schools for poor children from pre-primary to higher standards in urban and sub-urban areas. They cater to a small number of the targetted population.

**Yes**, because Vidyarambam's mission is unique. It helps poor in remote villages rather than in urban areas. It introduces literacy to the first generation learners. The resources of Vidyarambam are used for a greater number of the targetted population spread over many villages.

## How Vidyarambam is different from other NGOs

Most NGOs provide shelter to rehabilitate orphans, destitute children, street children, drug-addict youths, child labourers and so on.

Vidyarambam picks children who are still innocent, uninfluenced and raw and shows them the path to the class of literates.

## Our Plans for the year 2003-2004

According to the demographic statistics published by the Govt. of Tamilnadu based on Census 2001, there are 16, 317 rural units spread over 29 districts of Tamilnadu. The population of children of 0-6 age group in these rural units is registered as 40, 13, 112. About fifty percent of them do not have access to pre-primary education.

### Involvement

### Drop-out drops

Children in the 3-5 age group are very vulnerable. This is the right age to introduce literacy and it is also the age when the parents cannot use their children to supplement their income. Once they are equipped with basic education the children themselves opt for schooling rather than take up toiling with parents. And parents will not have a chance to drag them into labour force. Thus the drop-out rates will reduce and consequently the child labour too.



### Attitude Changes


The intangible benefit for the society is that the attitude of the parents is visibly changing. The parents who were otherwise indifferent about the education of their children reasoning that the children of poor folks are destined to remain illiterates for ever have interestingly and seriously determined to educate their wards and a ray of hope and happiness is lit on their faces.

### Latent potential unearthed

The tutors of Vidyarambam are SSLC pass, graduates, post-graduates and some of them are just eighth standard. They are unemployed housewives and other men & women idling at home. Though untrained they are intelligent and deeply committed to see that kids don't drop out of school for the same reason they had to. The latent potential in the villages in the form of teachers is brought to light.
